

Bob and his wife have been seriously active since they bought the beautiful Yellow Mark pictured above at an auction in Ftn Hills 13yrs ago. Bob is seen here receiving the JCCA "J&J People's Choice" award at January's dealer event. Notably, it was the 1st unanimous vote. But over the years, cars have been quite literally "a vehicle" for them. A vehicle for travel and making friends throughout the west by attending concourse, events, caravanning and "fun-runs" that they continue to enjoy. He could write a "book of stories from the road" from the adventures.

Currently, they keep an Austin Healy and a Lotus Elan in the garage along with the other 6 cars company, including a 1960 XK150, and his wife's F-type that is a 100pts car as is the Mark. In the past there have been an Opel GT, a few Porsches and some other Brit examples. A unique aspect of Bob's affinity to cars is shown by his adaptation of the "workings" of the XK 150 to make it a daily driver by adding A/C, among other changes to improve reliability. Along the way, they have won multiple trophies to include the prestigious *Muchenthaler* Trophy. The awards and accolades are not what gives them the greatest pleasure. Jaguar going all electric!



Jaguar will get its own EV platform under JLR's re-imagined electrification plan JLR CEO Thierry Bolloré said in an interview in 2021 with *Autocar*.

Called **Panthera**, the new platform will be "absolutely bespoke," Bolloré said. Designers and engineers are aiming to give Jaguar EVs distinct proportions to set them apart from those of sibling brand Land Rover, and that's being baked into the platform from the start.



According to reports, this will continue as new EVs arrive in 2022 and beyond. Announced last February, the Re-imagine electric strategy *canceled the new electric Jaguar XJ* sedan after years and billions of dollars in development but promised six new electric vehicles within the next five years—with an emphasis on SUVs. The plan for all new Jaguar model launches to be electric beginning in 2025 with 100% electric sales by 2030.

Recent reporting, using newly collated data, new car production switch is faster than its European rivals. **34%** of 2021 new car sales in the UK were electric models. This compares to some large companies, i.e. Ford, Volvo, Honda and Toyota producing less than 10% of their line. Major competitors like Porsche, Renault and Audi were well below. Sadly, the Land Rover release has been pushed to 2024. Investing 2.5 billion pounds and 44,000 new employees has positioned Jaguar be a European leader in EV models and on track to meet production targets of 2025-2030.

Jaguar has made some hard decisions to move into the 2020's and beyond. Among them is to eliminate the iconic sedans from production. The XJ flagship, along with the "baby Jags" X-type and S-type, have given way to SUV's and the very last remaining sportscar. Since the early 60's the XJ in its various guises have always been the Gentlemen's car. Now, markets and sales are changing the face of Jaguar. Watch for a detailed article in future newsletter issue on the venerable XJ.

We have returned the 4th Annual BEAR to the spring with a newly planned tour. Dates are on Sunday and Monday due to a safer and less congested drive on the roads and freeways.

The Tour is not only a driver's dream but one for photographers too. See spring desert blooms, the majestic Superstitions and Mazatzal Mountains as you pass into the Tonto and Coconino National Forests. Explore sites along the Mogollón Rim and in the quaint "winery" town of Cottonwood. You can climb the red rock switchbacks of Sedona and Oak Creek and catch a whiff the fresh scent of the ponderosa pines in Flagstaff. After arrival, don't rest too long.

Trippin' in Arizona



Arizona is unique in a number of ways. none the least are its vistas, points of interest and history. To enjoy them you need to go there, usually by driving. As the lyric begins “*If you get hip to this timely tip...*”, Route 66 is one such route to drive across the state. Coming east from Gallup, New Mexico going west, Rt. 66 crosses the state to the Colorado river, adding nostalgia to a drive of breathtaking beauty, charm and discovery that is uniquely Arizona.

Much of the discovery is just finding Rt. 66. Originally 350mi of the first “all-weather” U.S. highway linking Chicago to Los Angeles, it started in 1926 roughly following the 35th parallel taken by explorers and travelers for centuries. Today, most of the route lies beneath or parallel to Hwy 40, but a sharp eye will spot signposts along the way to draw you off into the past.

Holbrook is the first town from Gallup, NM after driving through the Painted Desert and Petrified Forest on the way past Meteor Crater, dubbed as Arizona’s 2nd most distinctive hole in the ground. Notably, the 1-mile wide crater is privately owned, but is a National Landmark. You can take a guided tour, view the meteorite causing the crater 50,000 years ago, an Apollo 11 space capsule, or the museum and gift shop.



The next stop is in **Winslow**. Check out the public park with a statue to the Eagles’ song of “a girl, my lord, in a flatbed Ford” fame. They hold an annual festival that draws crowds from around the country. (and a few flatbed Fords, lol.)

Again the song lyrics guide you thru **Winona** and **Flagstaff**. Don’t miss the attractions on this stretch of the Winona Trading Post and Walnut Canyon. Before Flagstaff proper and its notable historic downtown you can take a detour north on 89 to Sunset Crater Volcano. Flagstaff has hotels and cafes to make a welcome stop for hungry or tired travelers.

Williams, the gateway to the Grand Canyon, leads to **Seligman** where the first of Route 66 signs are painted on a stretch of the highway. The signs can be found along the route of some fun shops, eateries, museums, and historic buildings along with a working barbershop from 1927.



Don’t miss a stop in **Peach Springs**. the administrative headquarters of the Hualapai people, at the Grand Canyon Caverns and Grotto. The Caverns are the largest dry caverns in the U.S. You can explore along paved walkways, or take “off-path” Explorer Tours.



In **Kingman** be sure to stop for a homemade rootbeer float at Mr. D's diner. The Historic Route 66 Museum is housed across the street in an old power plant building. You'll find Rt 66 shields abound on the asphalt to lead you on .



Lastly, **Oatman** is a true old-west 1800's mining and ghost town. A village in the Black Mountains of Mohave County, it is named after an Illinois girl captured by local Native Americans in 1851. \$10 million in gold was discovered in 1915. Wild donkeys still roam the dusty streets of old shops where they can be fed while watching the daily gunfight show. And be sure to say hello to the mayor of Oatman. He's a donkey! Really.



Topock is the last stop in Arizona before crossing the Arizona line into California. It lies between Bullhead City and Lake Havasu. With a population of 2100 the little town may be hard to miss but this ends a journey like no other you'll drive in the USA.

Whether you plan short excursions or the full experience, you can "get your kicks on Route 66".

A unique drive across Arizona of wonder, charm and a renewed love of this great country and it's history that is sure to create lasting memories!


