

HELP! I have a Jaguar Problem! I can't stop looking at or buying them. After purchasing our 5th Jaguar, we decided to join the JCCA instead of starting our own chapter.

BACKGROUND:

I have been a Scottsdale resident since 1959, and my wife Lisa moved here in 1978. I am newly retired from Southwest Airlines (no, not a pilot) for 36 years. Lisa is an accountant and has been employed by the same firm for 36 years.

FIRST CARS:

My first car in high school was a rare, British 1968 Ford Cortina G.T. I believe this car was responsible for turning me into a British car nut. It was followed by a 1964 Austin Healy Sprite that was short-lived due to its prolific consumption of oil – leaking and burning. While attending A.S.U., I scored my dream car. A 1974 M.G.B. I still have it, garage-bound, until I can find someone to restore it. Lisa's first car was a 1979 M.G. Midget, but its reliability issues made it a trade-in candidate a year later.

My love of British cars evaporated for several decades. It was replaced by V.W.s of various types that were more suitable for family life. The British car industry was dramatically shrinking, as was the manual transmission, which was once a requirement of any car we purchased.

BACK TO BRITISH:

In the summer of 2016, I found myself looking at Jaguar XK8s – the closest I would probably ever come to owning an X.K.E. I ended up buying a 2005 XK8 convertible with 16k miles. It was zircon blue with an ivory interior and a navy blue top.

2018 I looked for an X-Type wagon (an Estate in England). I always liked wagons, and the Jaguar was reasonably priced and rare. Jaguar only sold 1,650 of them in the U.S. from 2005 to 2007. I bought a 2005 with 60k miles.

Sticking to the British and rare theme, I set my sights on another wagon – the XF Sportbrake. Jaguar would only sell 250 of this model in the U.S. from 2018 to 2020. In 2021, I found a white one with 7k miles for a great price.


2023 JAGUAR JACKPOT:

Upon hearing about our difficulty paying for the December Car Show while cruising on the Nile River, the Desert Chat Editor asked me to compose an account of our late November 2023 tour in the Middle East.

I can't prioritize: was it floating in the Dead Sea, beautiful Petra, or the magnificent vastness of Wadi Rum, the fantastic temples at Luxor and Karnak, or standing almost alone in King Tut's tomb, cruising on the Nile, standing in absolute awe at Abel Simbel, wondering at the ancient Great Pyramids at Giza, and Saqqara, or standing beside the Sphinx? In just one trip, I'd knocked off at least six items from my bucket list; it truly was the trip of a lifetime.

We had long wished to visit several non-religious sites in the Middle East, and this year, having lost our beloved Samoyed dog 'Oliver' last spring, we decided to make the trip prior to taking on another dog. We booked the trip months ago when all seemed so peaceful. As the trip approached, the news from Israel became increasingly alarming, and many people who had booked the trip decided to postpone or rebook. Our tour company posted a video assuring us there were no problems in the areas we planned to visit, so we decided to go.

We flew from Phoenix via London to Amman in Jordan. We were transferred to our hotel on the shores

never experienced such buoyancy before.


We visited Jerash, an old Roman city north of Amman, and then the fantastic 'Rose colored city' of Petra. We'll never forget the beautiful building facades cut right out of the living rock and our first Camel ride. Then on to Wadi Rum, a vast desert valley where T.E. Lawrence (of Arabia) joined Prince Faisal in 1916 to begin an Arab revolt against the Ottoman Empire. The movie Mars starring Matt Damon was also filmed there. Then we flew to Aqaba, where we flew to Luxor in Egypt. The ancient temples there and nearby Karnak are beyond description, so old, so well preserved, and so overwhelmingly beautiful and big.

We made an early morning visit to the Valley of the Kings, and in the predawn darkness, just the 9 of us entered King Tut's tomb. He is still there, in a glass sarcophagus. We boarded a beautiful river boat with 27 cabins with only 14 passengers, so the service was marvelous. For four days, we sailed upstream, southward to Aswan, stopping off daily to view more ancient Egyptian artifacts.


While sailing on the Nile, I received an email from our Jaguar club about the December Car Show and entered my wife's 05 XKR coupe, but could not pay for it. At Aswan, we flew up to Abel Simbel to see the famous temples of Ramses II and his wife, Nefertari.

Both were famously disassembled and moved to higher ground during the 1960s to prevent them from being flooded by Lake Nasser after the new Nile high dam was built. Unbelievably beautiful, unbelievably large, marvelously well preserved, inside, with much of the original paint still on the walls. You have to stand at the foot of just one of the four 40-foot-high seated statues of Ramses to understand just how vast and magnificent these temples are.

The next day, we flew to Cairo, where our hotel was in the shadow of the Great Pyramid—walking around those astonishing 4,500-year-old buildings. The Pyramid of Khufu, weighing over 6 million tons and comprising 2.3 million stone blocks, stands nearly 500 ft. tall, the tallest building in the world until the Eiffel Tower was built in the 1880s; you feel very small and humble. It's no wonder men have stood at its feet contemplating it in utter amazement for millennia. The magnificent Sphinx is sitting beside them, looking eastward toward the rising sun, its body showing significant erosion, but its head proudly held high.

As the sunset on the tour, I thought about the Jaguar Car Show and my toys. We have 3: a 98 XK8 coupe in BRG currently living in northern Minnesota, a 05 XKR coupe in Zircon Blue, and a 2011 XK coupe In Caviar. All are driven regularly, and none have ever left us sitting on the roadside (touch wood). Below my 3 Jaguars, the BRG 98 XK8 coupe, next the Zircon blue 05 XKR coupe, last is my 2011 XK in Caviar, behind it is my color-matching Snap-on toolbox, and in the corner is my Cessna 177B Cardinal.

Old Tech & New Tech

Growl of last combustion-engine Jaguar sports car preserved

The "unmistakable, supercharged" sound of the Jaguar F-Type V8 will be stored for posterity in Britain's national library, the luxury car manufacturer said... as it moves towards a quieter, electric future.

Recorded inside a special chamber at the carmaker's engineering plant in central England, the exhaust note of the last combustion-engine Jaguar sports car was recorded as it performed a number of gear shifts and acceleration sprints.

Recordings of the famous growl will be submitted to the British Library's archives alongside other culturally significant sounds such as the first street recordings of cars.

Charles Richardson, senior sound engineer with Jaguar, said the sounds were "something we want to be available for generations to come.

"Archiving it with the British Library allows us to do that, and that's something we're very proud of," he added.

The company's autonomous vehicles are using visual cues, recorded audio messages, and, most recently, LED displays on its roof dome to communicate intent to other road users.

For years, developers have been working on ways for driverless cars to communicate intent to other road users, either through audio recordings or visual cues. Today, Waymo says it wants to be one of the first companies to put some of these methods into practice.

Alphabet-owned The company's driverless Jaguar I-Pace vehicles will use their roof domes, which are wrapped in LED displays, to communicate messages to other road users. For now, the company is going with just two messages: for pedestrians in front of the vehicle, shifting grey and white rectangles meant to communicate that the vehicle is vielding to them, and for drivers behind the vehicle, a yellow pedestrian symbol to let them know there's a pedestrian crossing.

The symbols join other visual and audio cues that Waymo employs to "talk" to other road users. The company has used its roof dome to <u>display the initials of the customer</u> who is hailing the ride and to <u>signal to</u> <u>cyclists</u> that a passenger intends to open the door. Waymo also uses external <u>audio alerts</u> to communicate with emergency responders or to explain what the vehicle is going to do next, like rerouting.

Waymo calls these recordings and cues "tertiary communication." Human drivers have gotten pretty good at communicating intent to the people around them: a little wave of the hand, a nod, maybe some eye contact. And, if all else fails, we can lean on our horns or roll down our windows and speak our minds (sometimes colorfully). Waymo vehicles have no hands or eyes with which to communicate, so new methods needed to be invented.

Waymo calls these recordings and cues "tertiary communication." Human drivers have gotten pretty good at communicating intent to the people around them: a little wave of the hand, a nod, maybe some eye contact. And, if all else fails, we can lean on our horns or roll down our windows and speak our minds (sometimes colorfully). Waymo vehicles have no hands or eyes with which to communicate, so new methods needed to be invented. "We need to create a way for someone to say, 'OK, I know what that Waymo is doing, that Waymo is yielding, it's not going to drive right now," Smith said. "And as a driver behind this car, 'This Waymo is stopped because it's yielding to a pedestrian.' So that was one of our big challenges."

The most challenging thing was to figure out how to present them so they didn't come off as telling other people what to do, said Orlee Smith, senior product manager at Waymo. After all, Waymo didn't want to cast its driverless vehicles in the role of traffic cop, barking orders at pedestrians or trying to bully other drivers.

For now, the roof domes will just display the yielding-to-pedestrian symbols for road users in the front and rear of the vehicle. Waymo plans on rolling it out in San Fra cisco, followed by Phoenix and then Los Angeles. And since Waymo vehicles are equipped with LED displays on their domes, the possibility of integrating future messages is all but certain.
